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What is UNICEF Club Taskforce?

With the growing support, there are 37 member schools among the local and international schools (<u>list of member schools</u>). UNICEF HK is now recruiting volunteer Taskforce members to join a series of trainings. Upon completion of trainings, volunteers will be officially appointed as UC Taskforce members in support of UNICEF HK on coordinating club affairs.

Responsibilities

- Assist UNICEF HK in managing the UNICEF Clubs (mainly local school)
- Provide advice and guidance to UC students in completing their year plan
- Visit schools to facilitate participation and operations of each UC, share experience with students and assist them in problem-solving
- Build a friendly relationship with teachers and students, and to ensure smooth handover of club affairs
- Organize diverse training programmes for UC students to facilitate personal growth and learning of child rights
- Attend taskforce's monthly regular meetings, suggest improvement and share hand-on experiences with UNICEF HK in the advancement of initiative

Requirements

- Full-time tertiary student aged 18 or above
- Good communication and language skills
- Independent and good team work, proactive follow up with secondary school students on club affairs
- Interested in promoting child rights education, organizing trainings and educational programmes
- Able to complete service period of 2 consecutive years, or have know-how knowledge or experience in school clubs operation will be an advantage

Training Schedule

UNICEF HK will provide trainings to equip Taskforce members with relevant skills to coping with all situations. To ensure the service quality, members are required to attend all trainings. Members who are capable of managing UC effectively will be offered a letter proof for their service as an appreciation. This training scheme is free of charge, and transportation allowance can be provided.
